Minutes and decisions of 4 August 2020 meeting were accepted as a true record of the meeting.

#### 3. 2020 AGM Cancellation

The communication explaining the AGM cancellation and thanking the Long Leys resilient community volunteers went out in August. This included the 2018/19 accounts.

### 4. 2020/21 Finances

Thanks to Jackie for successfully applying for £500 in funding from the "Tesco Bags of Help COVID-19 Communities Fund". Thanks also to Jim for providing details of where to apply.

The grant is intended for COVID-19 related activities targeting vulnerable groups. After discussion, the meeting provisionally agreed that spend breakdown would be as follows:

- £100 for trialling Dial-a-ride services for vulnerable individuals. This could include a couple of group shopping trips to the supermarket as well as paying for individuals to trial the service.
  - Glenn to propose how this figure could be used in the November/December period
- £55 for daffodil planting to provide a spring highlight in Long Leys.
- £345 to provide a "community highlight" with the objective of lifting the mental state of those who have been isolated for some time. The initial thought was a combination of a small

visiting choir to sing carols combined with a gift of flowers and/or chocolates/xmas pudding.

Jim offered to provide contact details for "our Lady's Carolers" in Ermine Ward to see what activities 5 or 6 of them could do in the time of COVID-19.

Management committee to consider alternatives to the above, for finalisation at the next meeting.

Jon highlighted concerns over any "official list" being prepared of vulnerable people, as data protection considerations come into play. Also, that any activities should not require significant administration, so it becomes mainly a logistical exercise. Ideally it would address mental health and isolation issues, adding some variety and spontaneity rather than a "food parcel". Jon will also canvass the resilient community volunteers to ask for nominations of recipients and also to ask for other ideas from this group on how the money could be used. There are now 10 individuals on the offline vulnerable list, in 8 households.
