4. Footpath No. 3 closure (Albion Crescent to Burton Road roundabout)

Awaiting news on whether the LCC Capital Board has agreed to fund circa £50,000 for the new footpath. This would potentially be supplemented by £25,000 from the Long Leys S106 Community Fund, subject to support by Long Leys Residents. If Capital Board approval is given then JD to organise household consultation. Support will be needed to deliver newsletters across Long Leys. Those at the meeting agreed to help.

13. Speeding / Speed Indicator Device (SID) Update

JW undertook two Community Speed Watch sessions at Curtis (4 vehicles reported) and Cemetery (18 vehicles reported) with new volunteers.

There was a discussion on how to further reduce speed of vehicles round the bend at the A46 underpass. The Neighbourhood Plan contains some suggestions (maybe something by the 30mph limit signs which gives a better visual indication).

15. Liaison with Local Councillors

Current County Councillor priorities

- Repair/replacement of Footpath no 3 to Burton Road roundabout (progress reported in 4 above).
- Long Leys Road, Carram Way right turn outbound Lincoln traffic potentially clashes with inbound Lincoln traffic turning into Cloverleaf Care Home. This needs addressing as a safety concern. No feedback yet on progress.

• Larger litter bin on West Common at top / southeast corner of West Common has now been installed. Will take both litter and dog waste.
